

Yohan's Army: Show your Brickie Pride and Spirit! All students are invited to join at any point throughout the school year. Club activities include planning pep rallies, spirit week, and attending athletic events as a group to pack the events.

Esports: Provides a positive environment where students can play games with friends, become part of a team, and engage in healthy competition for our school. Currently offers 8 competitive games, all chosen based on interest and fun. Two seasons: Fall and Spring

<u>Kart Club:</u> Students build their own go-karts, tune the powertrain and chassis dynamics, and then put them to the test in the Racing Capital of the World, the Indianapolis Motor Speedway.

Teams compete in 4 categories to claim the championship trophy: Engineering Design, Community Outreach, Powertrain Efficiency, and Race Placement.

<u>Chess Club</u>: Open to anyone who plays or wants to learn to play chess. Students are able to compete in local tournaments. Meets weekly after school.

Support Groups

They bring in medical professionals to teach students about different careers in the medical fields & commit a monthly service project. Students can also complete first aid and CPR training.

<u>French Club:</u> Gives French learners a chance to meet with other students learning French and to explore cultural topics that are not covered in the regular classroom curriculum. Meetings, field trips, and after school activities take place monthly.

<u>German Club:</u> Learn more about Germany and have fun with other students. Activities include movie nights, field trips, and volunteer opportunities.

Psychology Club: Discusses and shares current topics and research in psychology including neuropsychology, social psychology, psychological disorders, and development. The club also examines psychological topics in popularized in media and film. Meetings are held throughout the year but most discussion is on Canvas. Activities include field trips and volunteer opportunities.
